NOG Area News.....

Greenwood Park Plats National Historic District

In 2011-12, North of Grand received \$3,500 in Polk County Community Betterment grant funds, and \$16,450 from the State of Iowa Historical Resource Development Program (HRDP) grant program, and volunteers donated about 1,000 hours of service to the project. We appreciate everyone's contributions and participation! A nomination for the Greenwood Park Plats National Historic District (39th to 42nd and from Grand to Center) has been approved by the State National Register Nominating Committee in October 2012. The State Historic Preservation sent the nomination for review at the National Park Service in January 2013 to be considered in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP).

NRHP designation honors this area's contributions to Polk County's history and opens the door for those residents to apply for state historic tax credits when rehabilitating their properties. The Middlesex National Historic District (31st to 35th Streets, Woodland to Center) was listed to the NRHP in 2000. With this designation, there are no restrictions on the property in the use, development or sale of private historic property. Tax credits are an invaluable financial incentive for property owners to invest in their historic property. This translates into increased property assessments, and in turn, additional future revenue for local governments. Residents will take pride in their rehabilitated properties, which will reduce blight, curb crime and boost the economic vitality of the area. Ingersoll-Grand SSMID District Approved

The expansion of the Ingersoll SSMID District was approved by the Des Moines City Council on January 28th. The district will complement the previously established Ingersoll-Grand Avenue TIF District and provide the necessary economic development and financing opportunities required to complete and maintain the Ingersoll and Grand Avenue Streetscape and Infrastructure improvements.

About SSMID's:

A SSMID District is defined as a Self-Sustaining Municipal Improvement District. Districts consist of contiguous areas of commercial property. SSMID Districts function by applying an additional tax levy to commercial properties within the district. The funds raised by the additional levy are managed by a board of directors and are designated to benefit the district. Possible uses include physical improvements, economic development, events, marketing of the district, maintenance, and administration costs. In order to be considered for SSMID designation, 25% of total assessed value, 25% of owners, and 25% of unique property owners must petition the City Council for approval. In the case of the Ingersoll-Grand District, nearly 60% of the assessed value signed the petition. It is important to note, the additional tax levy does not affect properties with residential zoning.

Background:

Since 1998, a group of dedicated business and property owners, along with city staff, neighborhood representatives, and civic minded volunteers have worked to accomplish a streetscape pilot project between 28th and 31st Streets along Ingersoll. The group has initiated and funded a revitalization plan for the entire district, and taken official steps with city government to establish a TIF district, among other economic development tools to expedite implementation of streetscape improvements and other recommendations of the revitalization plan. Funds raised throughout the past fourteen years have been used to contribute to the streetscape construction as well as formation of future plans for the district, and support and consensus throughout the community.



FREE Larger Tree Debris Disposal for Des Moines Residences Saturday February 16th 7 am – 2 pm at MWA

The Public Works Dept has arranged for residents to dispose of **larger tree debris**, free of charge, at to the Metro Waste Compost Facility at 1601 Harriett Street.

Residents must take the debris to MWA Compost Facility from 7 AM to 2 PM on Saturday February 16th, 2013. These provisions for the disposal of tree debris do not apply to business and commercial tree services.

Curb Removal: Residents must cut branches and smaller tree debris into 4-foot lengths and pack it into bundles 1 ½ foot in diameter. Property owners that brush, limbs and yard debris in the yard or on the right of way is in violation of city ordinance. The following is the ordinance and procedures to deposit of such items. These items found in the yard will receive a 14 day notice to clean up. These items on the "parking" right of way will receive a 48 hour notice to clean.

Depositing or storing outside a completely enclosed building items that constitute a threat to the public health, safety or welfare, including but not limited to the following: old or scrap rope, rags, batteries, paper, trash, rubber debris, tires, waste, used lumber or salvaged wood, inoperable machinery or appliances or parts of such machinery or appliances, vehicular component parts, iron, steel, old or scrap household goods or hardware, cut brush or wood including dead or decaying plant material except as contained in a compost pile or orderly stacked firewood if cut in lengths of four feet or less.

Requirements for Brush and Branches: Branches must be cut to 4 foot lengths or less and tied in bundles Bundles cannot exceed 1.5 feet in diameter Limbs must be 2 ½ inches in diameter or less (limbs, stumps, or logs larger than this will not be collected) Weight limit for each bundle is 40 lbs. Attach a "Compost it!" sticker to each bundle

Tree debris bundles must be placed on the curb with a Compost It Sticker ® on it for pick up on the regular Solid Waste collection day.
